

These primary water sources depend on rainfall and snow, which form a part of the hydrological cycle.





5. **Alliteration:** A figure of speech that involves the repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of words in a sentence or phrase. Example: "Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers."
6. **Onomatopoeia:** A figure of speech that uses words that imitate or suggest the sound they are describing. Example: "The sizzling bacon made my mouth water."
7. **Oxymoron:** A figure of speech that combines two contradictory terms or words to create a contradictory effect. Example: "Jumbo shrimp" or "bittersweet."

8. Irony: A figure of speech that uses words to convey a meaning that is opposite of what is actually stated, often for humorous or sarcastic effect. Example: "It's raining on my wedding day, how perfect!"

9. Idiom: A figure of speech that has a figurative meaning different from its literal meaning. Example: "Bite the bullet" or "It's raining cats and dogs."


